## Residents rocked all night

To celebrate 50 years rocking out to the Rolling Stones, East Meadowites headed to Edward J. Speno Memorial Park on June 13 and danced the night away to the Glimmer Twins, a Stones tribute band.

It all began in 1962 when a few friends performed for the first time at the Marquee in London. Five decades later, young and old fans are still gyrating their hips to hits that include "Paint it Black," "Sympathy for the Devil" and "(I Can't Get No) Satisfaction."
